But when multiple sclerosis began to rob her of

her physical abilities, the disease forced her to give up the sport that meant so much to her.

Then she heard about Oceans of Hope, a 67-foot yacht that was sailing around the world, operated by a crew of MS patients.

The unique voyage is a project orchestrated by Mikkel Anthonisen, a Danish medical doctor and psychotherapist who has been working with MS patients for 14 years. Both Lamb, who lives in Vermont, and Anthonisen were guests at Hats Off!, a gala at Pier 66 benefiting the MS Foundation.

Lamb spent a month aboard the boat, sometimes braving heavy winds and rough seas. Not surprisingly, however, when she first heard about Oceans of Hope, she hesitated. "But then I thought that if I didn't do it, I would always regret . it," she said. "I needed to prove that MS wasn't going to define me."

The Hats Off! Black-tie gala featured a festive cocktail reception, dinner and dancing. It also honored Drs. Ira and Marietta Glazer with a Fearless Volunteer award, and Dr. Daniel Kantor with a Leadership in Care award. The program also included a number of other speeches, however, and became too lengthy. But otherwise, the evening was a beauty.

Lynne and Ralph Mc-Grath chaired the gala, which earned \$95,000 for the MS Foundation.
